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Your prayers of support help to empower people like Bishna

The Leprosy Mission was founded in 1874 by Wellesley and Alice Bailey, and their friends the Pim sisters, to provide holistic support to people affected by leprosy. This is still the Mission's central work. Today, we have offices in 31 countries around the world. We partner with other not-for-profits and governments to provide healing and vocational opportunities to people affected by leprosy and disability. More than ever your prayers are vital to keep this work going and to see leprosy defeated in our lifetime. Our Triple Zero strategy to see the end of transmission, disability, and discrimination is grounded in the faithful prayers of people like you.

Bishna is an example of The Leprosy Mission and other organisations working together in unity to provide holistic support to people affected by leprosy. Now 38, she contracted leprosy at age eight. Her dad took her to Surkhet Hospital in Nepal, several days walk from her village, for treatment.

Thank God she started her treatment during the early stages of leprosy. As a result she did not develop ulcers and infections due to severe nerve damage. This could have resulted in loss of function in hands and feet and need surgery, and if left too late, even amputation.

Bishna was at the hospital for more than two years. She won everyone over, including the doctors, with her friendly attitude. During this time, she learned to read and do basic maths with help from hospital staff. She now only suffers occasionally from fever and nerve pain – side effects of her medications.

Bishna completed vocational training in handicrafts and tailoring. Then she went to New SADLE (Skill and Development Learning Experience). They provide training and employment to people affected by leprosy and other diseases. New SADLE are one of many producers providing artisan products to The Leprosy Mission Shop. They are also part of the World Fair Trade Organisation. Here, Bishna received skills training in Backstrap Weaving. Now she works in the Tailoring Section helping with tasks such as batik pasting, labelling and packaging.

Bishna is married and has two children. Her son, Bishal is 18, and studying Hotel Management. Her daughter, Smriti is 14, and at boarding school.
