Giving hope to people affected by leprosy like Bhuneshwar...

Bhuneshwar is now 18 years old. He spent three years getting treatment for his ulcers in private clinics. Finally, he received treatment and diagnosed at a Leprosy Mission Hospital in India. Bhuneshwar is the only child of his parents. He passed 10th standard in his education but left his studies 2 years ago due to leprosy. Leprosy took him away from his studies

and restricted his outdoor activities. Resulting nerve damage means he cannot feel his feet. And he has plantar ulcers on the soles. |He is taking Multi-Drug Therapy, as he has multibacillary (MB) leprosy. And then earlier this year had surgery to remove foreign matter and dead tissue from the wound.

Praise God! Now, Bhuneshwar's ulcer is healed! And thanks to people like you, he can get back to his normal life. He plans to join his studies again in the upcoming years. He wants to become a doctor and save people from the same problems he has faced.

Please pray for Bhuneshwar's continuing restoration and for others like him in Leprosy Mission Hospitals in India – that they can receive the leprosy care they need during this pandemic.

Thank you for the opportunity to share with you. Your compassionate support for people affected by leprosy continues to inspire me.

It has been a difficult and challenging time for many with the impacts of the global COVID-19 pandemic affecting us all.

Even more so will be the impact on those already affected by leprosy. In addition to battling leprosy, its stigma and discrimination, those we are trying to help also must now confront a virus which is swamping government health systems, creating more isolation in communities and disrupting drug therapies. In many cases employment or the ability to generate income through small family businesses has been lost.

At these times we can feel powerless and overwhelmed by the sheer volume of discouraging news stories and the tragic impacts on families, our staff, partners and the work in the field.

We can often feel alone - not sure of where to turn

or what response to make, whether that be spiritual, material or financial. Leading The Leprosy Mission at times such as these can feel like working our way forward through a thick fog of uncertainty.

At times such as these I personally take comfort in the name for Jesus - 'Immanuel', God with us.

We know that God doesn't promise a troublefree life, we don't always avoid trouble and strife. However, God does promise to be with us - the creator of the universe is with us today. When all appears lost, we are never alone.

One of my personal favourites is Psalm 91: 14-15

'Because He loves me' says The Lord, 'I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble.'

There is also a need I feel to be replenished or 'topped up', to be sustained in the ongoing fight against leprosy. My Christian experience also tells me that in times when I feel overwhelmed or 'empty' that it is about seeking Jesus to help me find strength in him. Jesus gives us the gift of spiritual food and water



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to sustain us — we just need to ask. Jesus earned this the hard way for us on the Cross.

Isaiah 55:1 'Hey there! All who are thirsty; come to the water!'

So as we face the challenges of a New Year, uncertain of what is ahead, I thank God that He keeps me focused on serving those affected by leprosy. I am motivated by Christ's example to love the poor and disadvantaged. I know you are too.

Your great kindness is truly inspiring. Without your help, people affected by leprosy may be left vulnerable and lose hope, in their time of greatest need. Families like Lalsari and Bishal's.

Bishal's smiling little face is well-known at the Mission's Anandaban Hospital in Nepal. Still just 9 years old, Bishal and his mother Lalsari have become regular visitors due to the complications of Bishal's leprosy. Bishal was first diagnosed when Lalsari noticed patches on Bishal's hands. Having had leprosy in the past, she knew the tell-tale signs. Bishal's young body has also reacted against the leprosy bacteria. Lalsari was forced to leave her husband and daughter and take Bishal urgently to the hospital.

As you can imagine, seeing her boy in so much pain was almost too much for Lalsari to bear. "When he started crying, I started crying too," she says. "I wanted to die." Bishal now needs a combination of medicines. He can't walk properly, and his face has

become bloated. Without ongoing hospital care, Bishal's condition will worsen. Without his mother at his side, he may lose hope. Thankfully, with support from compassionate people like you, Lalsari has found a job at a nearby paper factory (making wrapping paper sold through The Leprosy Mission Shop). This means she can stay close to her son.
